Rotary and the Fight to End Polio

Members of the Rotary Club of Volcano are proud to be part of an international organization that has been working for more than 40 years to bring an end to polio in the world. And we're almost there.



As a founding partner of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, we've reduced polio cases by 99.9 percent since our first project to vaccinate children in the Philippines in 1979.

When James Bomar Jr., then the Rotary International president, put the first drops of vaccine into a child's mouth, he ceremonially launched the Philippine polio immunization effort and Rotary's first Health, Hunger and Humanity Grant project was underway.

The project's success led Rotary to make polio eradication a top priority. Rotary launched PolioPlus in 1985 and was a founding member of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative in 1988. Through decades of commitment and work by Rotary and our partners, more than 3 billion children around the world have received a polio vaccine.

Since then Rotary members have contributed more than \$2.1 billion and countless volunteer hours to protect children in 122 countries from this paralyzing disease. Rotary's advocacy efforts have played a role in decisions by governments to contribute more than \$10 billion to the effort.

Today, polio remains endemic only in Afghanistan and Pakistan and the work to eliminate the disease there is continuing. It's just one more reason why our local Rotary members feel good about what we do.



SUNDAY WALK IN THE PARK – EXPLORING MAUNA ULU Sunday, February 11, 2024 10:00 am – 1:00 pm

This monthly program on second Sundays is aimed at bringing together the members of the Friends of Hawai'i Volcanoes National Park to explore the park's beautiful trails. This month's 3-mile round-trip walk explores the Mauna Ulu area.

Experience a lava landscape from the 1969-1974 Mauna Ulu flow. Walk by lava tree molds and climb 210 feet (64m) to the top of a forested cinder cone, Pu'uhuluhulu (hairy hill). View Mauna Ulu's steaming sheild, which is similar to the Pu'u 'Ō'ō cone in the distance. On a clear day you can see Mauna Loa, Mauna Kea and the Pacific Ocean.

Of interest: Pāhoehoe and 'a'ā lava, kīpuka (old land surrounded by new land), lava tree molds, cinder cones, lava rampart, native pioneer plants and trees and panoramic vista.

Distance: .8 miles one way, 1.6 miles round trip. | Difficulty: Moderate | Meet at Mauna Ulu trailhead.

Bring: Water, food, hat, sun protection & rain gear. Be prepared for hot, dry, wet and windy weather conditions.

This event is presented by the Friends of Hawai'i Volcanoes National Park, a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization. Program cost is \$5.00 for Friends members. Non-members are welcome to join the Friends in order to attend. And, of course, additional donations are always accepted. Park entrance fees apply.



Volcano School First SumoBot Competition, A Roaring Success

middle school SumoBot competition, part of the school's Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math (STEAM) curriculum, was a roaring success. Held on December 20 to close out the first semester, the competition pitted student-built robots against each other in a technological sumo tournament. Student competitors faced off their robots in a 3-foot dohyo (sumo ring). With no active controller and relying only on how well each student had programmed their device, each robot needed to identify the opponent, move toward it and push it out of the dohyo, all the while successfully adapting to the movements of the opponent to avoid being pushed out himself.

"The main purpose was to get students into computer coding, which can be a difficult concept," said Kumu Dale McBeath, and the competition was a fun way to do it. He notes that today's kids are passive consumers of computer content, but by building their own robots from scratch, then programming them to perform specific tasks, they are actually creating something unique. Kumu Dale teaches students the standard definition of a robot: "It is a physical device that senses its environment, does calculations, then takes action in the real world."


"In this competition we weren't creating 'battle bots.' We followed the sumo respectful practices of bowing to the opponent, good sportsmanship and congratulating the opponent after the match," he said.

"It was fun, but nerve-wracking," said competitor Joaquin. "I was very nervous beforehand but felt calmness once it started."

Another student likened it to a martial arts school. "When you spar with someone in your school, you're trying to beat him, but you're doing it to make him, and yourself, better. If someone had a problem coding something, I'll help them. I want all of us to have great robots."

"Ten out of ten – that's how the tournament was," concluded competitor David.

Prior to moving to Hawai'i and settling in Volcano, Kumu Dale worked in California as an animator at Industrial Light & Magic (George Lucas's company responsible for the "Star Wars" movies) and at Disney-Pixar (where he was an animator on "Finding Nemo," "The Incredibles," "Jumanji" and other films). "We are so fortunate to have Kumu McBeath teaching our students such valuable and engaging skills," said Principal Kinney.

Woodturning in Hawaii: A Rich Hawaiian Tradition. Native Hawaiians have carved wooden bowls for centuries. Originally, these skilled artisans shaped the wood using tools made from coral, lava, or pumice stone and they sometimes used shark or stingray skins to finish the surface. The result was the highly prized 'umeke lā'au (wooden bowl). Today, the tradition is carried on by local woodturners who use modern lathes and metal tools. Their skillfull work can be seen in galleries, hotels and museums throughout Hawaii. Mark Stebbins of the Big Island Woodturners shares his knowledge and examples of 'umeke.
