MAYOR ROTH TO HOST TOWN HALL IN VOLCANO ON THURSDAY, AUGUST 24

Mayor Mitch Roth is pleased to announce the third town hall of his series, "Sustainable Horizons: Mayor Roth's Community Impact Check-in," aimed at providing updates and fostering engagement with communities across Hawai'i Island. The event will take place at the Cooper Center in Volcano on Thursday, August 24, from 5-7 pm.

"Our administration is committed to listening to the community and incorporating their valuable insights into our actions," Mayor Mitch Roth emphasized. "These town halls serve as a platform for meaningful dialogue, where residents can voice their concerns and provide suggestions for improvement. We truly value the diverse perspectives within our community, as they guide us in better serving our residents and working towards a more inclusive and responsive administration. We encourage everyone in and around the Volcano area to join us on August 24 and actively participate in shaping a community that reflects the needs and aspirations of all of us."


The town hall series aims to establish an open and transparent dialogue where residents can stay informed about local initiatives, express their concerns, and actively contribute to shaping the future of their respective communities.

The event will begin with Mayor Roth and key cabinet members providing updates on the county's progress and direction during the first half-hour. These updates will be tailored to provide site-specific information relevant to the Waikōloa community. The remaining hour and a half will be dedicated to a Q&A session, enabling attendees to directly pose questions to department representatives and receive responses from subject matter experts.

For those unable to attend the in-person event, the town hall will be live-streamed on Mayor Roth's Facebook page (facebook.com/himayormitch) and Nā Leo TV, Channel 55. We encourage all residents to participate and engage in this critical community dialogue.



SUNDAY WALK IN THE PARK - EXPLORING KĪLAUEA IKI Sunday, August 13, 2023 - 10:00 am to 1:00 pm

This monthly program on second Sundays is aimed at bringing together the members of the Friends of Hawai'i Volcanoes National Park to explore the park's beautiful trails. This month we will hike the Kīlauea Iki Trail.

Descend through a lush rain forest to the floor of the solidified, however still steaming Kīlauea Iki Crater lava lake. Peer into the 1959 vent that erupted to a height of 1900 feet located below the Pu'u Pua'i cinder cone.

Of interest: Walking through a rain forest, viewing native birds, walk on the 1959 lava lake, view steam vents, cinder cones and spatter cones.

Ahu (stacked rocks) mark the trail across the crater floor.

Sturdy footwear, water, raingear, sun protection, and a snack are recommended.

This event is presented by the Friends of Hawai'i Volcanoes National Park, a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization. Program cost is \$5.00 for Friends members. Non-members are welcome to join the Friends in order to attend. And, of course, additional donations are always accepted. Park entrance fees apply.




2023 4TH OF JULY PARADE IN VOLCANO

Volcano School of Arts and Sciences August 2023 News

VSAS Mural: I Ola Hāloa

This past year, high school students at the Volcano School of Arts and Sciences created a mural covering an entire wall on the lunch lanai of the Old Volcano Road campus. The scene, depicts the moʻolelo of Hāloa.

In this mo'olelo, Wākea (sky father) and Papa (earth mother) had a son who died at birth and was buried. Out of his body grew the kalo plant. Papa became pregnant again and gave birth to a healthy baby boy, who they named Hāloa (everlasting breath) in honor of his older brother, the kalo. According to the chant, Hāloa is the first kanaka maoli and all Hawaiians trace their origin back to him and his older brother, the kalo plant.

The subject was chosen because our school theme this past year was I Ola Hāloa, a celebration of the close familial relationship between kanaka and kalo, and an honoring of our connection with 'āina as the land that sustains us.

VSAS resident artist Dena Nakahashi, a painter and VSAS parent, guided high school students from conception to execution of the project. "Our task was to show the significance of the relationship between the people and the land in the culture," she said.

"We wanted to show the heartbreak of what happened and the rebirth of the new," said Cheska Aurelio, a 10th grader who's been at VSAS for her entire school career.

Once the students had settled on a design and blocked it out on a large sheet of paper on the floor, they'd wanted to create a grid pattern and transfer that to make the larger mural on the wall. "But that wasn't working, so we just freestyled," Cheska said.

"I really tried to think about the story and what it symbolizes, and why it's so important to the Hawaiian people," she continued. "During this process I was really thinking about the ancestors and what they mean to us here at school." She remembered a class trip to the Volcano Art Center and how she was really affected by one of the art pieces.

"It made me feel so much. It took my mind into places I didn't expect," she said. "I hope our mural does that. I want this to be more than just a decoration. It should be feeling, emotion and thoughts—not just colors and paint."

This school year 2023-2024, our school theme is 'O Kīlauea Ka Ipukukui (Kīlauea is the lighthouse). This year will be a year of intensive vision work as we explore more deeply what it means to grow and learn in this place, near Halema'uma'u at the summit of Kīlauea on Hawai'i Island. Fee-Free Day for the Great American Outdoors Act Anniversary! The Great American Outdoors Act (GAOA) was established to protect critical resources, expand recreational opportunities and focus on long-term sustainable operations in your national parks. At Hawai'i Volcanoes National Park, GAOA funds will be used to rehabilitate both the aging water system and about 40 miles of perimeter fencing that protects native biodiversity. Interested in Practicing TAI CHI?

Tai chi is a traditional Chinese martial art which stresses slow, coordinated movements, in a sequence or "set" of forms. It is based on the principle of yin-yang. It depends on using the internal force "qi" (chi) rather than physical strength. It provides great exercise, flexing the body's muscles and joints, without straining them. It improves balance, coordination and flexibility, and it can help to reduce high blood pressure. It is "moving meditation", exercise which integrates body and mind.

I have been practicing Yang style tai chi for 20 years. My primary instructors have been masters from China teaching in Hilo. I have traveled to China three times for further tai chi training in Beijing and at the Hebei Medical Qigong Hospital in Beidaihe, China, where I received my certification as an Instructor.

I am currently teaching a tai chi class at Cooper Center in Volcano Village, once a week on Friday mornings from 8:30-10:00 AM. This class started in 2017. Most of the original students have moved on for various reasons, especially since the covid pandemic. The current class is small, and mostly new students. I want to recruit more new students. Classes are limited to 12 students. Classes are open to anyone interested in the Volcano area. Seniors are welcome. (I am a senior.) There is a fee of \$5/class. No fee for the first class, try it to see whether you want to continue.

You don't need any equipment to practice tai chi. All you need is comfortable, loose-fitting clothes and a good pair of shoes. We will be practicing Yang 24, a short introductory set, widely practiced in China. We will do warm up, stretching and breathing exercises before practicing the set.

CAUTION: If you have injuries or damage to your neck, back, hips, knees or ankles, practicing tai chi would definitely put stress on them, and could possibly result in injury.


