The 13th Annual Kamahalo Craft Fair invites crafters with quality homemade and homegrown products for the discriminating shopper unless approved by management. Volcano Village is a shoppers' paradise during the Thanksgiving weekend with the Volcano Artists' Tour. Our two-day craft fair compliments this community event and strives to serve a wide range of customer interests.

The purpose of this event is to support the activities and programs at the Cooper Center in Volcano. We love to have local artisans and craftspersons showcase their at this venue. Every year, our fair has been growing.

General Agreements:

All items must be homemade or home grown. Unless approved by management. All artists and craftspeople are professionals and should handle transactions and Interactions in a business-like manner

Aloha spirit + kokua + 'ohana = friendly environment which promotes good sales.

Setup begins at 6:30 am. All booths need to be set up and ready by 8:30 am. Closing is at 4:00 pm on Friday and 3:00 pm on Saturday. Please do not pack up your things until closing time unless you have sold out.

Parking: After dropping your things off, vendors are to park in the parking area next to the Volcano Fire house.

Security – Because the cost is so low, there is no funding for security. Vendors on the lanai, patio, and forest areas must breakdown on Friday afternoon and set up on Saturday morning. Those in the Grand Room should cover their items. Everyone must be responsible for taking security precautions.

Food Vendors – Food vendors must prepare all food items in a certified kitchen and must have a Department of Health permit displayed prominently at their booth.

Miscellaneous Information

- The volunteers of Cooper Center will be serving soup, coffee, tea and cocoa as part of its fundraising effort.
- Volcano weather can be cold and rainy. Please prepare for this by bringing jackets and tarps, particularly if you are in the garden and forest areas.
- If you must bring your young children, please have them stay at your table or in the playground, not running around, too many people and especially our kupuna because I have almost been "run down" by children running around unsupervised, sorry, but it must be this way.
- Do not bring any animals, unless they are a registered service dog, and they are caged or carried at all times.

Please clean up your area before leaving the craft fair at the end of the day.
