Last year, our Rotary Club of Volcano teamed up with the Volcano Art Center to start a new tradition in the village: a Christmas tree lighting ceremony that kicked off the holiday season. We were all pleasantly surprised when almost 200 people turned up for the event on the day after Thanksgiving.

It was a true community effort. The Art Center provided our Christmas tree — the 30-foot-tall remains of a once vibrant but now dead 'ōhi'a, which was festooned with eight strands of colorful lights. Volunteers from a local church donated hot chocolate, coffee, tea and cookies. Others set up a table where youngsters could make their own Christmas ornaments. Luminarias lined the art center's parking lot. Rotary members sold \$1 hot dogs and passed out 100 paper glasses that turned the tiny lights into dancing bears, angels, swaying bells and more. And, of course, Santa was there.

This year we're bringing it all back again – and hope that there will be even more ways to join in the party. In addition to the food and activities, we're planning to have more music, lights and maybe even a little bit of snow to get everybody in the holiday spirit. And the Art Center's gallery will be open late to help everyone jump start their holiday shopping.

For our Rotary members, it's all part of what we do best, helping wherever we can in the community. We think Volcano is the best place to live and we want to share that enthusiasm with all the people who live and visit here. After all, we are one of coolest places in the state, literally and figuratively.


# FUN-Raising at Volcano School

# November 2025 Events & Updates at Hawai'i Volcanoes National Park

A s most of you may know, our one and only Volcanoes National Park is "closed" for now. during the government shutdown. However there is still much you can enjoy.

- 1. The gates are open as no staff to man.(free entry)
- 2. The Volcano House with their restaurant and bar are open for their regular hours
- 3. KMC has their store, restaurant, bar, and bowling lanes, as well as their gas pumps.
- 4. The Volcano Art Center Gallery in the Park is Open from 9am to 5pm daily


Next item..one thing the government can't close down is Madame Pele, you can always go and enjoy her...have fun#!

The Kahuku unit is <u>no</u>t currently open or accessible at this time. In general, other areas within this park remain as accessible as possible. Visitors should be aware that while some services are unavailable visitors are expected to protect park resources by following all regulations and "Leave No Trace" practices.

#### **Designation of Activities During a Lapse (taken from NPS website)**


Excepted Activity - Obligations may be incurred for personnel performing excepted activities as described in the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Circular No. A-11, including activities necessary to protect life and property, activities expressly authorized by law, and activities necessarily implied by law. NPS activities in this category include:

- Law enforcement and emergency response;
- Border and coastal protection and surveillance
- Fire suppression for active fires, emergency stabilization, or staffing commensurate with Preparedness Level conditions;
- Protection of Federal lands, buildings, waterways, equipment, and other property within the National Park System, including research property;
- Activities essential to ensure continued public health and safety, including safe use of food and drugs and safe use of hazardous materials, drinking water, and sewage treatment operation;
- Activities that ensure production of power and maintenance of the power distribution system;
- Activities related to United States Park Police annuity benefits transfer (necessarily implied by law, 54 U.S.C. 103101(d));
- Activities related to facilitation of First Amendment activities including permitting and monitoring (necessarily implied by law, U.S. Const, Amend I); and
- Activities necessary to oversee or support excepted or exempted activities, including budget, finance, procurement, communications, human resources, and information technology services.
