First-Aid Training for Volcano Residents

VERT will be offering an Adult & Pediatric First Aid, CPR/AED Certification class on December 6, 2025, from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. at Cooper Center. This course teaches students to recognize and care for a variety of first aid emergencies such as burns, cuts, scrapes, sudden illnesses, head, neck and back injuries, heat and cold emergencies, and how to respond to breathing and cardiac emergencies to help victims of any age. Students who successfully complete this course will receive a certification to perform this level of first aid, valid for two years.

Friends of Hawai'i Volcanoes National Park Hawai'i Volcanoes Institute Presents

SUNDAY WALK IN THE PARK — KEANAKĀKO'I Sunday, October 12, 2025 - 10:00 am to 12:00 pm

This monthly program on second Sundays is aimed at bringing together the members of the Friends of Hawai'i Volcanoes National Park to explore the park's beautiful trails.

Join us for an exploration of Keanakāko'i crater. Walk through native forest and take in the breathtaking views. Keanakāko'i, meaning "cave of the adzes", likely formed during the 1400s, during Kīlauea's great summit collapses. Until 1877, Hawaiian kahuna kāko'i (carving experts) sought the crater's superior and rare basaltic rock for making ko'i, or adze heads. Bound to a sturdy 'au ko'i (wooden handle), this valuable tool was used to carve vital objects like canoes and houses. But the famous adze quarry was covered by lava, first in 1877, then again during the fissure eruption in July 1974. Today, the crater floor is 115 feet deep.

Walking distance from Devastation Trail parking area is 1.0 mile (1.6 km) each way.

This event is presented by the Friends of Hawai'i Volcanoes National Park, a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization. Program cost is \$5.00 for Friends members. Non-members are welcome to join the Friends in order to attend. And, of course, additional donations are always accepted. Park entrance fees apply.





"to promote the wellbeing of cats & dogs on the Big Island. We support responsible pet ownership & advocate for the humane treatment of animals,

through both adoption and TNRM (trap, neuter, return, and manage). Our fostering and adoption programs give a chance at a loving, lifelong home. Through education, community outreach, & partnerships with fellowrescues (PetFix Spay & Neuter & Paws Across the Waters Hawai'i), and the Hawai'i County Animal Control & Protection Agency, we are dedicated to reducing pet overpopulation, reducing disease, & improving lives.

participated in the adoption of over 1,400 Big Island animals!"

A4A and the talented and compassionate volunteer staff strive to provide foster homes for animals in need, until they can be adopted. A partnership with Pampered Pooch enables temporary shelter, as do strong partnerships with overseas shelters in Canada, Seattle, and Portland.

You might be surprised (or not) to learn that many across the pond find animals from Hawai'i hold an even more special place in their hearts. Because of this, the program "Pups Over The Pacific" was formed, and the Airline/ Transport Fees, Travel Crate, Vet Exam & Immunizations, Spay & Neuter for dogs making the journey to Eastern Canada and the US West are funded by donations (of any size).

Two of the recent rescues, Duke and Jasper, both participated in the VCA 4th of July Parade on leads held by A4A volunteers. A visiting couple from Missouri saw Duke and immediately fell in love with him, and after being put in contact with Lynn Morrison, started the adoption process that saw Duke with his new loving family in Missouri within a matter of weeks!

Volcano School of Arts & Sciences October 2025 News

Placed-Based Learning at the Volcano School

A critical part of the Volcano School's placed-based mission is to experience the places upon which that education is based. All classes go on huaka'i (field trips) for experiential learning connected to the classroom curriculum. Every Tuesday, middle school classes go on huaka'i and on September 23, 7th and 8th graders traveled to Hilo

On just one of their many huaka'i this year, 8th graders visited Mokupāpapa Discovery Center, where they enjoyed hands-on labs and displays on the local marine environment. As part of this year's science curriculum focuses on place-based geology, "we want our students to learn the geographical places that are local, and therefore of interest to them. Then we'll expand from there," said Kumu Linda Schubert. "It was really cool and fun," said Beckett Fossel, who is considering a career in marine biology.

At the same time, Kumu Ku Thomson and the 7th grader class spent the day at Waiuli in Keaukaha where a loko i'a (Hawaiian fishpond) is being restored by Hui Ho'oleimaluō, a nonprofit funded by Kamehameha Schools and additional grants. The group focuses on loko i'a restoration in the ahupua'a of Waiākea. Their work includes restoring native flora and fauna of the area, increasing cultural resources, and creating STEAM experiences that allow youth and adult participants to build the skills needed to further pursue local STEAM studies.

"Learning by doing and serving the community are Hawaiian values," said Kumu Ku. "Today our students are learning to build a wall, which makes the loko i'a and which feeds the community. Doing this is an example of komo piha i ka hana (to jump right into the task). It's a kind of learning that cannot be replicated in a classroom."

This year, middle school teachers are integrating Social-Emotional Learning curriculum and Nā Honua Mauli Ola Guidlelines into on huaka'i. Nā Honua Mauli Ola guidelines aim at creating culturally healthy and responsive learning environments. These guidelines emphasize the importance of incorporating Hawaiian culture, language, and values into education to support the well-being of learners and communities.



October 2025 Events & Updates at Hawai'i Volcanoes National Park

Kīlauea Volcano's Ongoing Eruption. Kīlauea continues to draw many visitors to Hawai'i Volcanoes National Park, and the volcano has erupted 32 times since December 2024. During eruptions, park visitation surges, traffic increases and parking is limited in popular areas along the caldera rim. Switchback Work Underway for Kīlauea Iki Trail. The western switchbacks of Kīlauea Iki Trail are temporarily closed for repairs and safety upgrades. The work occurs Monday through Thursday from 6 a.m. to 4 p.m. and the switchbacks are open to hikers outside of those hours. The rest of the popular 3.3-mile trail is open. The work should be complete by September 30.




